Medical Refuge

Biomedic Foundation was established by Dr Damir Shakambet and Dr Tatyana Bosh in 1995. Originally named 'Medical Refuge', its main objective was to create a new medical system for improving health. Therapy was offered to those affected by post-traumatic stress disorder, focusing on the bio-feedback loop between individual mind, body and social circumstances, for which Dr Bosh received a Millennium Award in 2000.

It has become increasingly evident that individual health is profoundly affected by the state of the world and collective consciousness, as well as vice versa. Since the birth of the new millennium, the charity began to create a network that encourages a more proactive involvement in global reality. For this reason, we extended our original constitution to include larger objectives, and in 2001 the name of the charity was changed from Medical Refuge into the Biomedic Foundation.

Campaign for Consciousness

Biomedic Foundation began its unique journey with 'Campaign for Consciousness' (C4C). It is a huge and ongoing project of positive contribution to both individual and collective health consciousness. People from all walks of life started to open-heartedly share talents and contribute to this new facet of our work. The campaign was particularly intensified and diversified from September the 11th 2001. Campaign for Consciousness now involves not just providing biomedical research and bioregulatory treatments, but also creative work in

education and publishing e.g. running courses, seminars, conferences, academies, societies; and has also begun to **work with the media – all with an intention to deliver the bioregulatory preventative healthcare to different strata of society.**

Orphan Voices

Campaign for Consciousness began with a project called ‘Orphan Voices’, which aimed to give a voice and a face to some of the more than 13 million children in Africa at the time, orphaned by the AIDS pandemic.

Doctor 2 Doctor Project

The following project that the Foundation launched via C4C in 2004, was referred to as the Doctor2Doctor Project. The aim of this project was to involve as many medical doctors as possible – to raise their interest in exploring the art of medicine beyond the techno-pharmacological approach, offering them free bioregulatory medical treatments, answering their questions, and exploring the common area of physicians’ drug-free interest.

Bioregulatory Medicine

Doctor2doctor project helped the charity collect relevant data, and to finally solidify the concept known as Bioregulatory Medicine. As Biomedic Foundation provided a forum for research, discussion and education to physicians, CAM practitioners and the general public, it gathered their talents and abilities together towards developing this new and entirely health-centred medical paradigm; which puts emphasis on preventative and regenerative medicine.

Academy for Bioregulatory Medicine

Believing that integration, bioregulation and prevention represent the future of medicine, and valuing the efficacy of the bioregulatory approach to human health, in 1997 Biomedic Foundation started running the Academy for Bioregulatory Medicine. Since then, the Academy has branched out with facilities running across the world; holding seminars and courses on bioregulation for holistic medical doctors, CAM practitioners, and the general public.

International Society for Bioregulatory Medicine

In order for this new paradigm of healthcare to become widespread, Biomedic Foundation established the International Society for Bioregulatory Medicine, to help gather like-minded medical practitioners and therapists, providing an international bioregulatory medical network for exchange of knowledge and experience. Today, the Society has a large network of its associated and trademarked societies worldwide including British, Irish, Serbian, American, Canadian and Australian societies for Bioregulatory Medicine.

Vibrant Health Project

The latest project of C4C has been the Vibrant Health initiative. The objective of this project is to introduce Bioregulatory Preventative Medicine into nurseries, schools, care homes for special needs and nursing homes; aiming for a new form of social welfare – raising public health culture and general standards of health awareness and practice.
